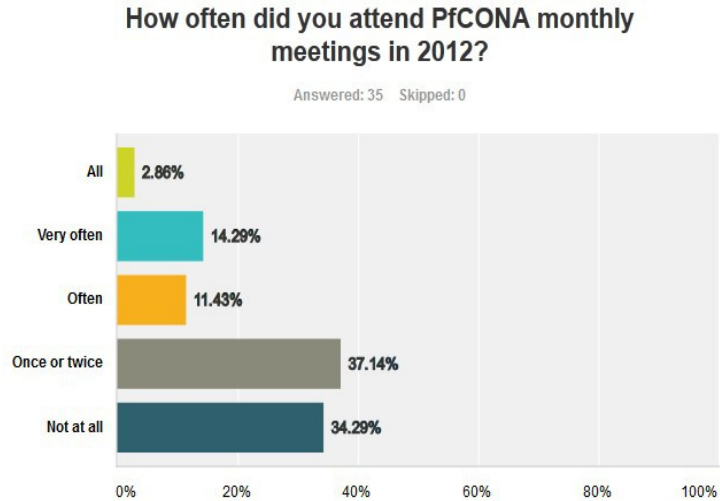

4. Please elaborate on any topic of strong interest. Why did you choose those topics? Know of a good speaker or resource expert or organization?

I don't think we should create another taxation district for an expansion of the Travis County ESD Fire Services. We should create a city run fire department, rather than a separate taxing district in addition to the existing taxing district for the ESD. Sounds like double dipping to me. We are also one of the only cities, other than Austin, that currently pays tax to ESD. Why don't we have a city fire department? What is the cost analysis/comparison? Has the city looked into that? San Marcos has it's own fire department and they have a slightly smaller population than we do. We have triple the median household income than they do and about 48% higher median house value. I imagine if they can make it work, so can we. We also have a smaller service area, 12 square miles vs. 19 square miles. They have a larger police force than Pflugerville, and they pay lower taxes. They have an airport, hospital and a university, and we have none of those. Really starts to make you wonder where the money is going? To pay the higher wages? My experience comes from I was an assistant researcher for the City of San Marcos and I would use Pflugerville and Round Rock, as well as a variety of other comparable cities around Texas when reviewing budget increase request and budget approval. I also just realized that we are the only large city (by comparison) in Travis County ESD: http://www.co.travis.tx.us/fire_marshall/esd.asp. It is mostly comprised of a bunch of neighborhoods. We probably have a larger population than all of the others combined. I think it is time we take the training wheels off. Don't you?
